

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Pelican had another successful school year in 2014-15 during a time of significant change in teaching standards and the way Oregon Department of Education measures student achievement in grades 3-12. Oregon is committed to providing a quality K-12 education for all students, regardless of where they live or which school they attend.

Common Core State Standards (CCSS) were fully implemented in English Language Art and Mathematics statewide in Oregon this year. Grade-level teaching standards are now aligned in all public districts and schools. These standards are a set of high learning expectations in math and English that are designed to better prepare K-12 students for success in college, work, and life. The standards offer a clear picture of what students should know and be able to do at every grade level.

Smarter Balanced Assessments is the new Oregon measure of student achievement in Grades 3-8, and 11. Students will take Smarter Balance English and Math tests **once at the end of the school year**.

Students who **receive a three or four** on the test (on a 4-year point scale) **are considered on track to graduate** high school college- and career-ready. These tests are one measure of students' academic success and **no student will be held back a grade or kept from graduating** based on the results.

Pelican Elementary student achievement data for the 2014-15 is listed in the Progress section under the School Performance (%) 2014-15 column.

As a disclaimer for lower scores than previous years under the OAKS assessments, Smarter Balanced is designed to challenge students and represent a baseline that teachers and parents can use to measure progress toward college and career readiness. Lower scores do not mean that schools are performing worse, or that students are learning less. As with any changes, there is a period of transition as teachers and students get used to the new standards and tests.

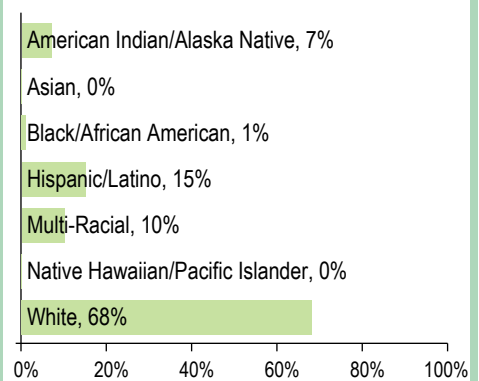

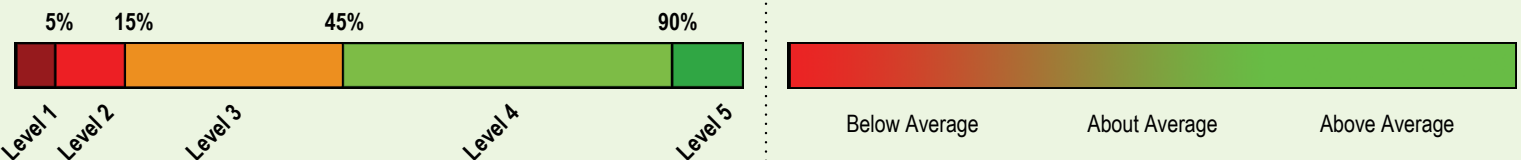

SCHOOL READINESS

- Every student was eligible to receive both **free breakfast and lunch** in 2014-15.
- 96% of **parents (telephone survey)** rated Pelican as **“Welcoming and Friendly”** and 94% strongly agree/agree, “My Child is Appropriately Challenged.”
- **School-based counseling services** available to students/families.
- Full-day Kindergarten for all students, since 2008.
- Weekly **Character Education** classes, Grades K-5.
- **School-wide PBIS** Positive Behavior program.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

- **Response to Intervention (RTI)** for all students.
- 21st Century **After-School Program** for Grades K-5.
- **Title I Staff** support.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

- **Differentiated Instruction** methods, including AVID teaching strategies for Writing, Inquiry, Organization, Collaboration, and Reading (WICOR) are used.
- **After-School Program** with focus on English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Art, and Physical Education is available to all students, with over 40% of Pelican students participating in 2014-15.
- General Music, Grades K-5, twice weekly.
- Band/Orchestra, Grade, twice weekly.
- Typing Agent **Keyboarding Program and Media Technology** classes.
- Technology Tools: iPads, Computer Lab, Interactive White Board (Promethean) for teaching and learning.
- **Healthy Schools Program/Alliance** for a Healthier Generation.
- **Physical Education** taught three times a week for 30 minutes.
- **Destination Imagination:** 2014-15 Oregon State 1st Place Winners, Global Competition participants.
