

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2015-2016 school year, Roosevelt Elementary School outscored the state average in **reading, math and science** even though this year there has been a significant change in teaching the Oregon State Standards and in the way Oregon Department of Education measures student achievement in grades 3-12. These standards, also known as the Common Core, are a set of high learning expectations in math and English that are designed to better prepare K-12 students for success in college, work, and life.

Roosevelt's Key Academic Achievement Highlights:

- Roosevelt's students outperformed the state average in reading by **8.1%** and outperformed our like schools by **5.6%**.
- We are most proud of the fact that Roosevelt's students outperformed the state average in math by **16.2%** and outperformed our like schools by **12.5%**.
- And lastly, our students outperformed the state average in science by **9.4%** and outperformed our like schools by **1.6%**.

- We will continue to set high expectations for all children during the 2016-2017 school year.
- Attendance continues to be a very important factor in a child's education. We have been focusing on improving attendance. This will continue to be a focus for us throughout the 2016-2017 school year.
- Once again, without parents, our bus would grind to an abrupt halt. They are an essential part of our culture supporting us all at every turn. 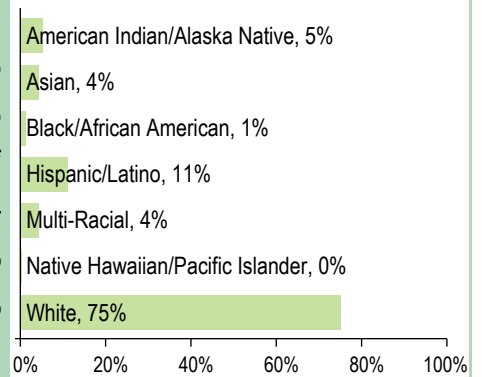

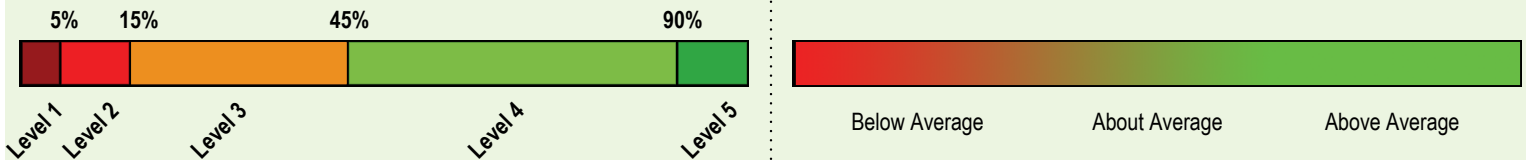

SCHOOL READINESS

- Roosevelt Staff collaborated/administer our Welcoming Survey.

- 95% of parents feel that Roosevelt has a warm, welcoming, and inviting environment.
- 99% of parents gave Roosevelt either an A or a B for the overall grade. High percentage of Positive Feedback.
- 98% of parents found Roosevelt's office staff and personnel welcoming.
- 93% of the students stated that they have a friendly adult at Roosevelt that they could talk to if they had a problem.
- 96% of students participated in at least two service projects.
- School-based counseling services for students and families.
- PBIS Positive Behavior Intervention Program/Character Education.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

- At Roosevelt, we built a strong block schedule that ensured that all identified students receive additional 30 minutes of interventions in math and reading as well as a healthy CORE.
- Differentiated Instruction methods, including AVID teaching strategies.
- CORE Math instruction 75 minutes daily.
- CORE Reading instruction 90 minutes daily.
- Computer-based supplemental curriculum (AR) for grades K-5
- Computer based typing program (Typing Agent).
- After School Program with focus on English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Art and Physical Education.
- Individual Goal Setting Conferences.
- Special Education Programs: support for students with qualified learning disabilities.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

- At Roosevelt, all students receive general music twice a week.
- All students participated in SPARKS P.E. twice a week.
- Students in grade 5 have an opportunity to participate in band or orchestra.
- Students in grade 5 also participated in Science Outdoor School.
- All students participated in Youth Starts which is provided by Ross Ragland Theater. Youth Starts is a program that teaches our students drama, theater and movement.
- Roosevelt's Parent Teacher Organization continues to support Roosevelt's students by funding assemblies in science, art, and drama.
- During the 2015-2016 school year, 98% of students participated in at least two community service projects. Secondly, all students participated in Klamath Falls City Schools Give Back Day.
- Roosevelt's students made placemats for Eldorado Heights and students in 1st-5th grade picked up trash throughout our community.
- After School Program is offered for all students.
- Summer School is provided for all students.
- Staff supports students to meet personal growth targets.
